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Introduction:

Baba Sahib Dr. Bheem Rao Ambedkar sacrificed his life to secure rights for Dalits in India and succeeded in putting the Dalit caravan on the way to progress. We can all see the result in front of us: discrimination against Dalits is legally banned. In fact, affirmative action has been integrated into our constitution. A proportionate number of jobs and also places in educational institutions have been reserved for Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STs). As a result, some of us have succeeded in becoming educated and in obtaining government jobs. For these privileges we are indebted to Dr. Ambedkar as well as to our society. We need to pay back to the society and push our societal caravan a bit further on the progress road.

The organizations, Innovative Institute for Development and Education of All (IIDEA) and Dr. Ambedkar NRI Association (DANRIA) have been established to allow us to pay back to society and to push our society's progress a bit further down the road to "liberty, equality, fraternity (brotherhood)".

Dr. Bachchu Lal has played a key role in organizing IIDEA and DANRIA. He founded DANRIA in the USA; and decided to visit multiple states in India, in order to meet Dalit leaders throughout the country. With Dr. Lal's help and the help of his new and old friends in India, IIDEA has been founded. A brief synopsis of his tour of India is given in the Appendix-I.

In the last few years, Dr. Bachchu Lal has visited Maharashtra, Delhi, Rajasthan, M.P., Bihar, Chandigarh, Haryana, UP and Uttarakhand. He met social workers, community organizers and activists in many parts of India and has kept in touch with them via phone from the USA. With their help and encouragement a trust called Innovative Institute for Development and Education of All (IIDEA) was founded in 2010 and registered in 2011. It was decided that IIDEA would focus on educational projects as well and on developmental projects depending upon availability of funds, volunteers and partners. It was also decided that IIDEA will pay special attention to the Scavenger Community, as this community is at the very bottom of the social structure, and until the very bottom is raised, the whole society will continue to suffer from inequality, extreme economic and educational disparity, injustice and strife.

Dr. Bachchu Lal also founded another organization; this one is in the USA and is named Dr. Ambedkar NRI Association, (DANRIA) (www.danria.org) The headquarters are located Baltimore, MD, USA, a city near Washington, D.C. and home to Dr. Lal. DANRIA is tax exempt under 501(c)(3) (2007) The organization was established to help untouchables and the underprivileged and poor in India, especially those coming from manual scavenging communities.

IIDEA & DANRIA share aims and objectives; it is but natural for them to collaborate. It is hoped that after IIDEA obtains FCRA, our US compatriots eager to help their brethren in India will find a suitable conduit to help through DANRIA and IIDEA.

Aims and objectives of IIDEA:

IIDEA's mission is to foster equality and justice in society. The organization's objectives are as follows:

- 1-Establish new schools, coaching centers, vocational training institutions, colleges, and universities for the downtrodden.
- 2-Prepare students for various competitive examinations such as IIT-JEE, AIEEE, IAS, MCE, AIPMT and others.
- 3-Establish hostels in cities and near educational institutions for impoverished pupils.
- 4-Encourage individuals to form Self-Help Groups (SHG) of 10-20 people and to implement the concepts of micro-insurance, micro-savings, and micro-credit within these groups. These groups will operate in a democratic fashion. Some of the bigger groups may go on to form cooperatives.

Progress report of IIDEA for 2010/2011:

After registration, IIDEA received support from DANRIA, and Teach International, Inc, located in Maryland, USA to start educational centers among Dalits in poor locales in India.

Computer center at Lucknow (2010):

IIDEA, with the help of DANRIA, established a computer center equipped with five computers to serve the Scavenger Community at Balmiki Colony, Daliganj, Lucknow. Students learn computer basics at this center. Initially these students were scared to even touch the computers but now the same students have achieved a measure of computer mastery. ***This computer center was also supported by Teach International and Wyn Stevens Foundation, USA.***

Computer center at Saharanpur (2010):

DANRIA funded Rs.45,000/= for a computer center in the Dalit community, in Saharanpur, U.P., in collaboration with Suprabhat Samajik Sanstha, Saharanpur. Mr. Gaurav Dahia, was responsible for this center. He also started a coaching center for English, Math and Science.

Donation to another organization:

IIDEA donated Rs 75,000/= to a Dalit hostel in Meerut. This hostel has 17 rooms and houses about 30 students. Residents receive free food, books and tuition fees; the students attend various schools. This hostel is run by Mr. Jai Pal Singh, President, Balmiki Shiksha Prasar Samiti, UP.

Taught Ideology of Dr. Ambedkar in the Scavenger Community (2011):

IIDEA donated Rs 7000/= (Rs.5000/= donations and Rs.2000/=travel expenditures) in Meerut for a meeting to promote awareness of DANRIA and to discuss the ideology of Dr. Ambedkar among Balmiki Community. Mr. Amar Singh, Dr. Rahul Das, Mr. Ramesh Gehlot and Mr. Jilay Singh participated in the meeting.

IIDEA aided a Dalit female victim of atrocity in Bihar (2011):

Parivartan Kendra is a registered organization, headquartered in Patna, Bihar and works in the Vaishali and Patna districts of Bihar. Sunita Devi, a victim of Dalit atrocity, was given Rs.5000/= to fix her back door so that she could protect herself from further assaults in the dark of night. This money was given to Ms. Versha Bela, President of Parivertan Kendra by Professor Satinath Choudhary, DANRIA member and Vice President of IIDEA. *This money was contributed by Prof. Choudhary from his personal funds.*

Help for educational awareness program among the very poor Mushahar, DOME and Scavenger Community in Bihar (2011):

The condition, of Mushahar, DOME and the Scavenger Community in Bihar is very bad, Ms. Sudha Verghese works in these communities. Prof. Satinath Choudhary, met with Ms. Sudha, and learned about the work of her programs. He donated Rs 10,000 to Ms. Sudha to pay for an educational awareness program presented to very poor Mushahar, Dome, and Scavenger students and their parents.

Self help group (SHG) among poor Dalits in Haryana, helped by IIDEA (2011):

Mr. Sanjeeve Gharoo, Haryana, received Rs.9000/= from IIDEA, to start a self help group in Haryana. Dr. Bachchu LAL, President of DANRIA and convener of IIDEA, donated this money from his personal funds. The functions and objectives of the SHG are as follows: Each member will save one rupee per day and IIDEA will contribute the same for each member. Each group will have 20 members. This program will accomplish at least two goals. Members will develop the habit of saving money and will then be able to rely on their savings for emergency needs and will not have to borrow from illegal money lenders. These illegal money lenders charge 10-20% interest per month for the small loans that poor people require for their emergency needs. As of this date, Mr. Sanjeeve Gharoo has not yet submitted his progress report for this project. An official letter was sent to him requesting the report.

Progress report of IIDEA (2012):

Scholarship program for Education:

Mr. Anand Kumar, TX, USA, a member of DANRIA and supporter of IIDEA, pledged \$500 (Rs.25,000/=) to DANRIA per year, to provide scholarship one boy (Rs.11,000/=) and one girl (Rs.11,000/=) from the manual Scavenger Community in India. Application form and Requirements for scholarship are on the website of www.theideacom.com.

Computer center at Leelmatha, Lucknow:

Dr. Bachchu LAL, President of DANRIA and Convener of IIDEA project paid Rs.55,000/= to establish a computer center at Leelmatha, Lucknow. Mr. Mukesh Kumar, Mr. Santosh Kumar Valmiki and Mr. Chandra Prakash were witnesses to receive donation. Dr. Bachchu Lal participated in inaugural function.

Dr. Rajgopal, Ph.D., Tamil Nadu/Karnataka (2012):

IIDEA financially supported Dr. Rajgopal, a student from the Scavenger Community who had received an appointment as a Post-Doctoral Fellow in the state of Texas, USA

but who had no money for his visa or air fare. Mr. Amar Lal Machal (750377723), Karnal, Haryana, gave Rs.20,000/= for his visa application . Once Dr. Rajgopal received his visa to travel to the USA Dr. Bachchu LAL, president DANRIA (www.danria.org) bought his plane ticket for him and also supported him in the USA upon his arrival. Dr. Lal was assisted by DANRIA member Mr. Ananad Kumar who lives in Texas and was therefore geographically closer to Dr. Rajgopal's place of work than is Dr. Bachchu Lal who lives a thousand miles away in the State of Maryland. IIDEA spent Rs.90,000/- on this project. It is most appreciated that Dr. Rajgopal has completely refunded the money

Computer center at Nirala Nagar, Lucknow:

IIDEA / DANRIA established a Computer Center at Nirala Nagar, Lucknow. Approximately Rs.70,000 were provided.

Helped two Scavenger Community girls to attend classes 11th & 12th in Lucknow:

The students were recommended by Mr. Ganesh Kumar, IIDEA member. IIDEA provided tuition fees, books and uniforms. IIDEA will also provide help for higher education for these girls.

Computer Center Teacher's salary:

IIDEA is providing a portion of the Center's teachers' salaries. IIDEA is donating about Rs.5000/= per month. From now IIDEA will be fully responsible for teachers salary.

Progress report of IIDEA (2013):

Computer Center at Nishatganj, Lucknow:

IIDEA / DANRIA established a computer center at Nishatganj, Lucknow. This training center was proposed by Mr. Santosh Kumar Valmiki and Mr. Mahendra Prakash. The Center's inauguration was held on July 18, 2013. IIDEA donated about Rs.90,000/= to buy five computers.

Sewing Center and Evening Coaching Centers in TN:

These centers are under the supervision of Mr. Gautama Sakthivel (09790233463), President, IIDEA Committee Coimbatore, TN. Address: 12/88, Mahalakshmi Nagar, Udumalai Road, Pollachi-1, Coimbatore, 643003, TN. Mr. Gautama is Managing Trustee of the Center for Social Service and Action. IIDEA/DANRIA donated funds to establish a sewing center and three evening coaching centers at Coimbatore and paid Rs.100,600/= (Rupees one lacks six hundred) for this project. *Money has already been donated by IIDEA, but DANRIA has received substantial support from Teach International, Maryland, USA & Mr. Anand Kumar Balmiki, TX, USA. Therefore DANRIA will bear some of the costs for these Centers.*

IIDEA office and Computer/Coaching Center serving the poor Dalit Community in Sultan Puri, Delhi: This computer center in a slum area of Delhi will also serve as an IIDEA office. This project requires Rs.100,000/=.

DANRIA is planning to start several additional coaching centers located in poor communities in small villages or city slum areas in 2014.

Proposed plan for 2014: Tutoring and Coaching Centers

The current state of most government run schools is quite deplorable, but good quality private schools are too expensive for most Dalit students. Helping more than a few Dalit students attend private schools would be too expensive for IIDEA and DANRIA. Moreover solving the school problem by sending the students to private schools will only weaken the government schools further. For the same amount of money it costs to send a few students to private schools, we can arrange for private coaches and tutors for a larger number of Dalit students attending government schools. This tutoring and coaching is the best way for organizations like ours (IIDEA and DANRIA) to help Dalit students attending the government schools. Therefore IIDEA is planning to establish about 20 evening coaching centers in poor Dalit communities. These coaching centers will be available to students from class KG to 12th.

The teaching strategy will likely vary to suit the individual needs of the students and teachers. It is likely that for some, students the traditional teacher centric coaching may be most productive. However, in certain circumstances the “study center”- like environment may be more suitable. It is possible that students from various levels/classes may need to be grouped together for tutoring, or perhaps only students from one class may need to be taught. Possibly, some difficult or slower students may need individual attention. In some locations, the coaching may take place right after the school hours; while in other situations it may be better for students, families and teachers to arrange for evening coaching and study groups. If they can afford it, some students may be charged a small fee; others who cannot afford the fee may be taught for free. Students preparing to go to college will likely require additional tutoring and coaching in the 11th and 12th grades.

There are innumerable possibilities and innumerable ways to teach. In words of Dr. Bachchu Lal: “At the time I was studying for my B.Sc., I was living in a Scavenger Community. In order to survive and to pay for food and housing, I taught about 30 students from class 1st to 5th in one batch. Each student paid Rs.10/= month but often these students were not able to pay their fee. In the second batch, I taught 3 students from class 6th to 10th and each student paid Rs.15/month. By discussing my own experience, I would like to send the message that it was very tough for these poor Scavenger Community people in a slum area of Lucknow, a big city and capital of U.P., to pay even Rs.10/= month for their education.”

It will be for the local IIDEA working committee, in consultation with the concerned students and teacher(s), to decide the modality of teaching. IIDEA will pay the major portion of the teacher's salary.

How can DANRIA/IIDEA establish an evening coaching center: some possibilities?

- 1- Establish a local IIDEA committee of 7 to 10 people from the community who can contribute at least Rs.50 to 100 per month.
- 2- The parents of the students will not pay any money.
- 3- Hire teachers from our community who will charge a smaller fee.
- 4- Place a special focus on students who are studying in class 11th to degree courses as teachers for class 1st to 8th.
- 5- Prepare a budget for 10 months with classes running for 10 months.

- 6- Discuss plans with the State IIDEA Committee.
- 7- Central Committee will pay very three months to the President of the Community, IIDEA Committee, or IIDEA will make other arrangements to pay the the salary for teacher.
- 8- If some poor students need financial assistance to buy paper and other suuplies then the Community IIDEA Committee will establish a budget for these costs and will submit a proposal to the State Committee. Central will provide monetary support.

OR- we can ignore all that has been mentioned above and let the local IIDEA working committee design and decide on their own strategy to accomplish their goal. As long as their activity has something to do with education (including physical education, sports and games) and development, their plans should be fine with IIDEA.

Details of Dr. Bachchu Lal's travels in India

Contacts with Community people to establish IIDEA. Report for 2010:

November 9, 2010 Meerut, U.P.: Dr. Bachchu LAL, Mr. Amar Singh and Dr. Ravinder Singh went to visit a hostel for Dalits in Kakan Khera Meerut. This hostel is headed by Mr. Jaipal Singh, Joint Sale Tax Commissioner, Banaras and President, Balmiki Shiksha Prasar Samiti, Meerut. In this hostel, 35 students live in 17 rooms. Students receive free food, books , paidfees and other support per need of the student. The students who came to live at the hostel were from very poor families. They allwere close to dropping their studies, but Mr. Jaipal Singh helped them and now these students are doing very well. A few of these students scored a first division in High School. DANRIA via IIDEA donated Rs.75,000/= for this hostel.

November 9, 2010, JNU guest house, Delhi: We met with Mr. Ramesh Gahlat, MA. LLB, Dr. Kuldeep Kumar, Ph.D., and Prof. Phool Badan, Ph.D. to discus IIDEA.

November 10, 2010 Chandigarh: Dr. Bachchu LAL and a guest from Maharashtra attended a meeting organized by Mr. Jogendra Singh at Cahndigarh. About 30 people attended the meeting. A few people from Punjab and Haryana also participated.

November 11, 2010 Haryana: We went to PUNCHKULA, Haryana. About 75 people were present at this meeting. Most of the people were from the Scavenger Community along with some advocates, teachers and activists. This meeting was organized by Mr. Sanjeeve Gharoo.

November 12, 2010 Delhi:

11 AM: Meeting with Mr. Ashok Bharti.

3.00 PM: Discussion with Mr. Mehar Chand (Delhi, Dwarika) Phase 1.

4 PM: Began a meeting with Mr. Mehar Chand at Lok Nayak Bhawan, Khan Market, 4th floor, Delhi. Approximately 75 intellectuals, activists and officers including Mrs. Kamala Goojar, Chairman, Safai Karmchari Ayog and Mr. Hari Ram Sood, member of the Safai Karmchari Ayog attended the meeting. People from Delhi, M.P, A.P., U.P., were present. I discussed my proposal and received an appreciative and enthusiastic response with assurances of participation in the program. This meeting was organized by Mr. Pradip Karausia, Ratlam, M.P.

6 PM: Meeting with Dr. Rajkumar Verka, Deputy Chairman, SC/ST National Commission. This meeting was organized by Mr. Nand Kishore, retired PCS officer UP cadre. Also attending were Mr. Nand Kishore, Mr. S.C. Patray, Mr. Mehar Chand and Dr. Rahul Das. Dr. Rajkumar Verka also appreciated our program and assured his assistance for the education of these poor people.

November 13 to 14, 2010 Meerut, U.P.: Meeting at Kakkan Khera, Meerut. Approximately 300 people attended. People showed appreciation for the project run by Mr. Jaipal Singh. We also presented the program of IIIDEA. Meeting participants were enthusiastic and gave assurances of joining the program. This meeting was organized by Mr. Jaipal Singh.

November 14, 2010,., International Guest House, Delhi University: A meeting was organized by Mr. Amar Singh, General Secretary, SC/ST Employees Association Delhi University. Dr. S.K Sagar, Ph.D., Dr. Jai Kishan (A.P.), Ph.D., Dr. Ravinder Singh, Ph.D., Dr. SS Berwal, Ph.D., Mr. Shankar Lal Bika, Mr. Om Prakash, Mr. Jilay Singh, Mr. Vinaya Sagar, Mr. Sultan Singh (Panipat, Haryana) and Mr. Chandra Bhan Singh were present.. I presented my project and people appreciated it and assured me they would join the program.

November 24, 2010: Meeting at Banda, U.P.: Dr.Kuldip Kumar (Balmiki), Ph.D., Political Science, JNU, Delhi, organized this meeting. Banda is a very backward city in UP. Please note one very important Scavenger Community social rule at Banda. the rule "NO ONE IS DOING MANUVAL SCAVENGING" means no cleaning of dry latrines. About 75 activists were present at the meeting. Every one appreciated the program.

November 28, 2010: Meeting at Gwalior, M.P. This meeting was organized by Dr. N.K. Barsana, Medical Officer, Chattarpur District, M.P. In Gwalior. I also had a small meeting at Balmiki Mandir, near Jain Petrol Pump, Kampoo, Lashkar, Gwalior, 474001, M.P. Mr. P.L. Nahar, Retired Executive Engineer, organized this fruitful meeting. I had a nice conversation with Mr. Deshraj Singh, M.Sc. Microbiology (71% marks) and several other and well educated people. M.P. Balmiki Samaj Vikas Sangh, Gwalior, also organizes collective marriage ceremonies for the poor society in order to decrease individual expenditures. November 30 and December 1, 2010: Meeting at Bhilwara, Rajasthan, Chittaurgarh. This meeting was organized by a retired bank officer, Mr. Sita Ram, National Vice President, SCEWASTAMB, Bhilwara, Rajasthan, Phone 982-903-1740. D. M. Bhilwar donated some land to IIDEA. for building a school Mr. Sita Ram bought additional land adjacent to the above parcel and prepared a blueprint of the school building design. The blueprint plan was submitted to the Government of Rajasthan in 2007 but to date he has not been able to raise the money to start building. Additionally, during this visit, we had a press conference and meeting at Bhilwara, and we also visited Scavenger Community

colonies.

December 3, 2010 Ratlam, M.P.: Mr. Pradeep Karosia, Leader, SC/ST, Employees Association, Eastern Railway, organized this meeting. I also visited a Dalit colony where about 3000 Dalit families live in one locale. The colony was very clean but education standards were very low.

December 4, 2010, Bhopal, M.P.: Meeting at Balmiki Mandir, Etwara, Bhopal, M.P.: Mr. Pradeep Karosia, Lrader, SC/ST, Employees Association, Eastern Railway, organized this meeting.

December 5, 2010 Agra, U.P.: Meeting at Balmiki Vatika, Near Subhash Park, Agra, UP. This meeting was organized by Mr. Ram Prasad, State President, Rastriya Balmiki Jan Vikas Manch (9720776393, 9368117569). About 50 society leaders and activists attended the meeting.

December 10, 2010: Meeting at Varuna Hospital, near Sitaram Nursery, Manduadoh, Varavasi. The meeting was organized by Dr. R.S. Anand (Balmiki), M.D., Cardiologist. Dr. Anand's wife is also an M.D., a gynecologist. His brother-in-law, Dr. ML Verma is M.D., specializing in Orthopedics. Both attended the meeting as did the Deputy CMO, Mirzapur and several other activists and leaders of the Dalit Community..

December 11 to 18, 2010: I visited Pune, Mumbai, Shirdi, and Nagpur. We had a pleasant and productive meeting at Manuski, Pune. The meeting was organized by Mr. Kaviraj Fattu Sanghelia and Mr. Mangesh Dahiwale. About 150 people attended..

We also had a good meeting and Scavenger Community visit at Nagpur. This meeting was organized by Dr. Sushant Mishram, M.D., Associate Professor, Nagpur Medical College and Mr. Omprakash Mahto, Scavenger Community activist. Here I met with Mr. Sunder Lal Tankbhore and learned about his program for the community. I talked with a Scavenger Community student, named Ayesha Turkel (937-317-8824, 9371-941-706) who earned 94.8% in High School and is also a classical dancer. I talked with Scavenger Community Student, Ankita Tunkel (9890682090), student of BE, Electronics, Design Technology who is planning to do post-graduate work in Electronics and Design Technology.

December 19, & 22, 2010: Meeting at Delhi: Mr. Mahender Singh Matiyala (989-186-4828, 965-413-6836) and Mr. Amar Singh (9350064144), organized this excellent meeting. I also met with Mr. Netram Narayan, Assistant Labor Commissioner Delhi, Mr. Amar Lal Machhal, Engineer CPWD, Kurchertra, Karnal (981-313-6939), Mr. Ashok Kumar Birla, Joint Director, Rajya Sabha Secretariat.. These people are doing very important work for the Community. Mr. Machhal also said that if any student in the Scavenger Community is planning to go for IAS training, he will provide as much financial and other support as he is able.
